The Idea



Testing self-declared and third party certified products purchased on the open market and comparing their compliance with relevant rules and regulations.

Results

Third party certified product compliance

< 1% dangerous faults

Non-compliance of 3rd party certified goods can occur when manufacturing procedures are changed without 3rd party involvement. Regular audits help to reduce these occurences. Non-compliant products are immediately reported to the certifier and manufacturer.
